TASMANIAN ORIENTEERING SERIES (TOS)

TOS EVENT AND POINT SCORE GUIDELINES:

- There will be 7 TOS events each year.
- TOS points are awarded to competitors at each TOS event.
- TOS events are course based.
- Points are only awarded to competitors on courses 1 – 6 inclusive.
- Points are awarded according to the formula 1st = 10 points, 2nd = 9 pts,... etc PLUS 10 points for being within 5% of the winner, 9 pts for being 5-10% of the winner, etc .. to 1 pt for being over 50% of the winner's time.
- Minimum point score recorded is 2.
- Final cumulated TOS point scores can only be claimed by members of an orienteering club.
- A competitor running "down" may exclude themselves from TOS points.
- Competitors total TOS points are based on their best 5 of 7 events.
- Organisers points are given to event organisers based on the average of all events they have taken part in.
- At the end of the series certificates are awarded to 1,2 & 3 Male and 1,2,3 Woman on EACH course up to course 6.

ORIENTEER OF THE YEAR:

Until 2003 the Orienteer of the Year was the male (course 1) and female (course 2) with the highest TOS points. The Orienteering Tasmania Board determined on 20 March 2004 that the award would in future be made to the male with the highest 5 out of 7 TOS points and 3 out of 4 SL points combined (course 1) and the female with the highest 5 out of 7 TOS points and 3 out of 4 SL points combined (course 2). This will apply from 2004.

INDIVIDUAL EXCELLENCE AWARD

This trophy was donated by the UFO club (now amalgamated into WROC) and is presented each year to the orienteer gaining the most club points in the TOS competition.

Club points are awarded at each TOS event, for Courses 1 to 6. They are calculated using an adjusted minutes per km rate system based on age and gender. The aim is to be amongst the 25 fastest adjusted km rates for the day, with the fastest being awarded 25 points and the 25th fastest awarded 1 point. The fastest six from each club in the list of 25 have their points aggregated to determine club points for that event, and those points are totalled through the year to decide the winner of the inter-club competition.

The individual orienteer who gains the most points from 9 out of 11 TOS and State League events is awarded the trophy for individual excellence.

The adjustment is made according to the following formula:

$$\text{Adjusted km. rate} = \frac{\text{Course time}}{\text{Course distance}} \times \text{Age factor}$$
