# 12. General Business:

- OT Secretary and Treasurer positions Klaas spoke to this. He is now doing 3 jobs. This is obviously unsustainable. The Treasurer's position does require corporate knowledge, but recruiting a paid person for at least a portion of the job may be the solution. \$200 an hour for an Accountant. The board is also looking at ways to simplify administrative tasks. Christine has done a tremendous job as Treasurer over the past 3 years.
- Newcomers at the Nats (Julian) (see attached)
  Julian has drafted a grant application to the Mary Whitehouse Fund designed to encourage newcomers to continue with orienteering. Capped at 10 per State, the proposal includes free entry to next year's Carnival (10 per State), an Si Air stick, a free T Shirt and a pre-Carnival introductory Tasmanian participants only and offer free Club membership rather than a T Shirt. Julian will put together another proposal based on feedback.
- Travel assistance for the 15 juniors who have been selected in the 2025 Schools Orienteering team (Liana). We congratulated Liana and team and agreed with Julian's suggestion to offer each selectee \$250.00. Klaas will deduct the \$250 from Invoices and Australopers will reimburse OT.
- Membership and Learn to Orienteer Programs (Mike) Membership is growing. Australopers now
  has 234 members. One third of our members are under 20. This points to the success of our Learn
  to Orienteer Program. SHOC is planning some Come and try sessions, and EVOC is doing a L to O
  course prior to the next Twilight series.
